FAQ: "Should we sign up for a recognized homeschool diploma?"
Ans: Only if your son/daughter will need one.

FAQ: "Do students need a recognized homeschool diploma to enter college?"
Ans: Recognized homeschool diplomas are not required for enrollment into higher institutions. The question you need to ask the admission's officer is, "Is there **an advantage** of my son/daughter applying to your institution with a recognized homeschool diploma as compared to a parent issued diploma or no diploma?"

FAQ: Is a homeschool graduate more competitive in the job market with a recognized diploma?
Ans: It depends on the employer. A "GED" or "High School Diploma" is often required for entry- level jobs. Employers are accustomed to hiring public and private schooled students that graduate with a state recognized diploma.

FAQ: Does a recognized diploma hold more accountability then a parent issued diploma?
Ans: Ask a college admission's officer or potential employer.
